There are three of us who monitor the posts – Izzi Hazelwood, Lucy Cox and Julia Hunter-Anderson. We have published on Facebook our policy on what we will and will not accept to post. When we delete a post we will send a private message to the sender so that they are aware why.

## **Parish Council News**

- On May 2<sup>nd</sup> there will be district and parish council elections. Names of candidates must be with Stratford District Council by April 3<sup>rd</sup> and will then be displayed on the parish council noticeboard and on the website.
- **Dog fouling:** Apologies once again to all those owners who consistently remove their dog's mess from the paths, pavements and roads. There is a substantial fine for those who do not. There have been more complaints than usual recently about dog mess being left on pavements, in driveways and in someone's flower beds. It is possible that a dog has been loose in the village but allowing your dog to roam can also be an offence. And please would those who adorn trees and bushes with the blue plastic poo bags just carry the bag with them!
- **Books in Boxes:** There are 2 boxes in the bus shelter full (to overflowing) of books left for anyone who fancies a read to help themselves to. Until we can think of a better place to keep them which is always accessible we need to restrict the books to INSIDE the boxes. If you would put a tick in pencil inside the cover of a book you have borrowed that would help to identify books which would be better taken to charity shops. Please don't bring more than one book at a time to put in the box. We would welcome any comments about the books, the boxes, where and how we could have a better system would someone build us a book cupboard somewhere round the village hall? Let the Parish Council know.
- The Portabello Crossroads safety improvements: In September we reported that the work on improving was due to start in November 2018. The work has apparently been delayed for the nth time by the fact that the lighting plan had to be approved and tenders have gone out. You will notice that nothing has happened and it is now 2019. The parish council are trying to get this moved on but with little success.
- The 5 houses being built at Harolds Orchard: there are 2 x 3 bed, 2 x 2 bed houses and one 2 bed bungalow which are due to be finished in approx. July. Warwickshire Rural Housing Association will rent these houses out. To be eligible for one of these houses you must have: a) been born in the parish or b) have lived in the parish or c) work in the parish or d) have a close relative in the parish. The first step is to register with the District Council's housing register (www.homechoiceplus.org.uk) then when you have had confirmed that you are on their register, you should go to the Warks Rural Housing Association website (www.warwickshireha.org.uk) and fill in the 'Register of Interest Form' for the village of Stretton-on-Fosse. If you have difficulty with these forms please contact anyone on the Parish Council. If you have no internet you can always access a computer at Shipston library. We will remind the village as the dates become clearer. If you know of someone who is eligible but will not receive this newsletter please let them know.
- **Parish Council Information:** On the website you will find the minutes of the last but one meeting of the parish council and the annual accounts. The minutes of the last meeting are only passed as correct at the <u>next</u> meeting so only appear in draft form and are liable to correction. Look under the parish council section. If you do not have access to the internet keep an eye on the 3 notice-boards in the village.

#### Village Playground Fund-Raising

We are one year into raising funds for the new playground equipment which will include adult outdoor equipment. We are sometimes asked what is wrong with the current equipment: the Parish Council has it safety checked every year and the wooden equipment is beginning to rot mainly below the surface and has now only a couple of years of life left. All the steel equipment – swings, long slide, rocking horse and igloo is safe and will stay.

So far we have managed to raise the magnificent sum of £17,000. We are amazed at the village's talent for fund-raising – children, parents, the pub, grandparents, events like the U3A Orchestra, Burns Night, villagers and visitors – all have contributed. Watch out for more fund-raising – SOON!

- large and small print titles
- spoken word
- books for young children
- no fines or charges and free book requests
- information on the Internet
- local, library and County Council information screens

#### Access and comfort

- low entrance with two small steps
- ramp at the rear for wheelchair users
- air conditioning

#### **Stretton Biodiversity Group**

The Stretton Biodiversity Group aims to support the conservation of nature in our village and foster a growing interest in the natural world. We help to monitor and improve key local habitats and species, including maintaining native wild flower patches around the village and the Spinney alongside the gated road. These in turn are helping to support native wildlife - from bees to bats and hedgehogs to hawk moths. We also organise community events, talks by experts and visits to interesting habitats.
